Boardroom Diversity	Bias : An unbalanced weight for or against an idea or a person that often influences your decisions.
Company Competition	Founder: Someone who starts a new business.
<u>Consumer</u> <u>Diversity</u>	Market Landscape : The full picture of the market a company is entering that helps it assess competitors and other factors to determine the scope of its opportunities in that market.
Entrepreneur	Pitch Deck : A brief presentation that provides an audience with a snapshot of your business plan. Entrepreneurs show pitch decks to venture capitalists in hopes of being funded.

Product	Racial Equity : Being just, impartial and fair and providing equal opportunities across different races of people.
	Silicon Valley : A region in northern California – some 40 miles south of San Francisco — known for its technology entrepreneurs and its ecosystem of innovation and financing.
	Unconscious Bias : When people are guided by deeper beliefs about people or ideas that they might not know they even have.
	Venture Capitalist : A venture capitalist, also called VC, invests capital in a company that has high growth prospects with the hope of a healthy return on that investment.
	Venture Firm : A company involving venture capitalists that invests capital in companies with growth potential.
	Venture Industry: The industry made up of venture firms and venture capitalists.
